Performances will be graded as follows:

Merit: (60 % -69%)
Bronze: (70 % - 79%)
Silver: (80% - 89%)
Gold: (90% - 95%)
Cum Laude: (95% - 100%)

One copy of the Adjudicator's report shall be issued for each solo entrant and one per group.

No entrant will be allowed to enter more than once in the same class in the same year.

No entrant will be allowed to substitute for another.

No entrant may perform the same work twice.

ADJUDICATORS

- 1. The Executive Committee shall have the power to appoint Adjudicators in place of any who are unable to attend and to appoint additional Adjudicators wherever necessary.
- 2. No Adjudicator shall be allowed to compete in any class, nor shall any pupils or professional colleagues of the Adjudicator compete in any class of which he or she is an Adjudicator.
- 3. Where there is more than one Adjudicator each will write his or her report separately.
- 4. Adjudicators are obligated to give percentages for award purposes, but these will not be made public.
- 5. The Adjudicator's decision is final.
- 6. Irrespective of the number of entrants, awards will be given if the standard is sufficiently high.

AVAILABLE CASH AWARDS

SENIOR BURSARY: Age 16 and upwards.

A cash bursary of R1000 donated by the Cape Town Eisteddfod will be awarded to the best

Senior candidate. Bursary contenders must participate in at least TWO classes.

The winner will also receive the Cape Town Eisteddfod Senior Bursary Award medallion.

INTERMEDIATE BURSARY: Ages 13 - 15.

A cash bursary of **R800** donated by the Cape Town Eisteddfod will be awarded to the best **Intermediate candidate**. Bursary contenders must participate in at least **TWO classes.** The winner will also receive the Cape Town Eisteddfod Intermediate Bursary Award medallion.

JUNIOR BURSARY: Ages 9 - 12.

A cash bursary of **R600** donated by the Cape Town Eisteddfod will be awarded to the most promising **Junior entrant.** Bursary contenders must participate in at least **TWO classes**. The winner of the Junior bursary will also receive the Nancy Farquharson Junior Bursary Award medallion.

IMPORTANT NOTES FOR ENTRANTS (please read carefully)

1. CHOICE OF MATERIAL:

NO OFFENSIVE LANGUAGE OR MATERIAL MAY BE USED. THE MATERIAL MUST BE SUITABLE FOR THE AGE GROUP IN WHICH THE CANDIDATE IS ENTERED. A broad selection of material is encouraged, drawn from a variety of cultures and performance styles. The use of local writing is encouraged

2. RECOMMENDED TIME:

Solo Performance allocated times per age group must be adhered to.

Please state length of group presentations on entry form. This time must be adhered to.

3. LANGUAGE:

Presentations and adjudication will be in English.

4. CERTIFICATES:

All certificates will be sent Digitally.

Certificates can be printed and delivered at an additional cost, depending on the number of certificates and delivery location. Please arrange with the convenor should you want certificates delivered through POSTNET.

Groups will receive **ONE** detailed report and ONE certificate per group member.

(PLEASE ENSURE ALL GROUP Members NAMES ARE ON THE ENTRY FORM.)

Solo entrants will each receive a detailed report ON THE DAY OF PERFORMANCE.

5. SETS:

Setting up and striking of props, furniture and rostra should not take longer than 3 minutes and should be carried out by the cast. Please inform the convenor of all sets, props etc being used.

6. DOCUMENTATION:

All entry forms must be typed to ensure correct spelling of names.

(Please do not submit handwritten entry forms)

Typed copies of all prepared work must be PROVIDED TO THE CONVENOR ON THE DAY OF PERFORMANCE.

7. ENTRIES:

All entrants are allowed and encouraged to enter more than once class.

To qualify for the cash bursary entrants must participate in at least **TWO classes.**

Schools with multiple solo entries are encouraged to enter a group performance piece.

Any queries regarding the rules or the interpretation of the rules should be made in writing to the CONVENOR of the Speech and Drama section of the Cape Town Eisteddfod.

The announcer will take all candidates into the foyer and hand them the extract only 5 minutes before their individual appearance. They may remain in the hall after they have read.

Extracts must be memorised. The acted story may be a complete story or an extract from any narrative source such as a novel, myth, legend, folk tale, or oral tradition.

Groups must consist of 3 or more actors. Material must be memorised.

Costumes, make-up, props, and music may be used.

PREPARED PUBLIC SPEAKING

Prepare a speech on one of the following topics:

Maximum time limits may NOT be exceeded in this class. Use of filing cards for brief notes is permitted.

Present stories of real-life successes, as well as struggles to illustrate these points and increase the audience's engagement level. Make sure to inject positive energy into your speech.

By presenting topics in a motivational manner, you can help ensure that members of your audience feel encouraged, empowered, and inspired.
